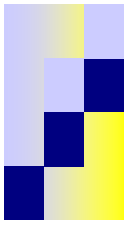

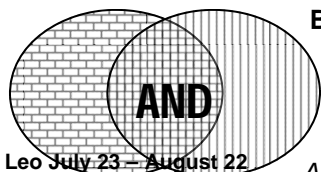

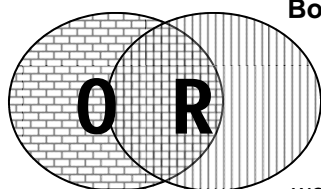
COMPUTER LITERACY

Simple Boolean - Boolean logic is useful when searching Google, Dog pile or any other search engine and is very simple. When used in constructing a search expression, it can be very useful in specifying exactly what information you want. The basis of Boolean logic is illustrated by the following venn diagrams:

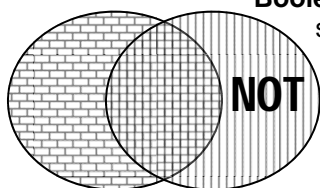
Gemini May 21 – June 21



Boolean 'AND' This is expressed as '**bricks AND stripes**' in a search. When using AND in this search expression, results retrieved will contain both checkerboard and stripes information. The results will not include those documents containing only bricks or only stripes information. In the diagram the documents retrieved by using this search expression are contained within the green area. **EXAMPLE:** *art AND schools* will retrieve all records containing both keywords *art* and *schools*.



Boolean 'OR' This is expressed as '**bricks OR stripes**' in a search. When using OR in this search expression, results retrieved will contain either bricks information, or stripes information, or bricks and stripes information together. Such a search will not merely retrieve documents containing only bricks information or only stripes information. In the diagram the documents retrieved by using this search expression are contained within all the colour areas. **EXAMPLE:** *ceramics OR pottery* This will retrieve all records containing the keywords *ceramics* or *pottery*, as well as those containing both.



Boolean 'NOT' This is expressed as '**bricks NOT stripes**' in a search. When using NOT in this search expression, results will contain only bricks. The NOT operator will exclude stripes completely and thus any green information will be excluded also. It is important, therefore, to be careful when using this operator in order to avoid hindering your search. In this diagram the documents retrieved by using this search expression are contained within the bricks area. **EXAMPLE:** *film NOT photography* will retrieve all records containing the keyword *film* but not the keyword *photography*. <http://sun3.lib.uci.edu/jariel/boolean.html>

Bush sends letter to North Korea's Kim Jong Il

President Bush has sent a letter to North Korean leader Kim Jong Il urging him to disclose his country's nuclear programs fully, the White House said Thursday. The president sent the letter Saturday, along with letters to other leaders of nations participating in six-party talks about Pyongyang's nuclear program, said National Security Council spokesman Gordon Johndroe. Bush also spoke by phone Thursday with Chinese President Hu Jintao, according to China's Xinhua news agency. "In these letters, the president reiterated our commitment to the six-party talks and stressed the need for North Korea to come forward with a full and complete declaration of their nuclear programs, as called for in the September 2005 six-party agreement," Johndroe said in a statement. Bush and China's Hu discussed bilateral relations and the Iranian and Korean Peninsula nuclear issues, Xinhua reported. Along with Beijing, South Korea, Russia and Japan have been participating in the talks, which were spurred after North Korea defiantly conducted its first known nuclear weapons test in 2006, prompting international condemnation and sanctions. Pyongyang also is suspected of sharing its nuclear technology with other nations.

Mexico to exhume more than 4,000 human remains



CIUDAD JUAREZ, Mexico

(AP) -- Authorities in the Mexican border city of Ciudad Juarez said Wednesday that they plan to exhume the remains of more than 4,000 unidentified people buried in common graves and take DNA samples in an attempt to identify them. Rene Medrano, a spokesman for the Chihuahua state attorney general's office, said the bodies were being exhumed because state attorney general Patricia Gonzalez "wants to bring order and clarity to past police practices.

"Officials did not provide more exact reasons for the exhumations, which they called part of a statewide project that includes at least 180 exhumations in another city. Authorities said the project was not directly related to the cases of 360 women

-killed over the past 14 years in Ciudad Juarez, a city of 1.3 million across from El Paso, Texas. Victims' relatives have long demanded that independent investigators take part in the probes, saying efforts by state officials have been tainted by inept officers.

Chihuahua state investigators have been accused of losing or contaminating evidence and of other missteps that botched cases. Authorities' lack of progress in solving the cases of the Ciudad Juarez women prompted international outrage, as news of the killings made headlines around the world.

Authorities have arrested and prosecuted a number of suspects over the years, but family members of some Juarez victims say authorities have yet to bring the true culprits to justice. Federal authorities intervened in 2003, promising to solve 14 rape-strangulation cases involving teenagers and women in Ciudad Juarez.

The federal attorney general's office recently closed those investigations, however, without getting to the bottom of what happened. A team of 30 people, including forensic anthropologists and dental specialists, are already exhuming remains from cemeteries in Ciudad Juarez, Medrano said. The team will exhume unidentified bodies that were buried in common graves between 1991 and 2005, Medrano said. They will extract DNA samples and build a database. The remains then will be tagged and reburied in individual graves, he said. Officials estimate more than 4,000 unidentified bodies were buried in common graves in Ciudad Juarez alone over the 14-year period. The program first started three months ago in Chihuahua City where authorities exhumed 180 sets of remains. One already has been identified, Medrano said.
