




On the way to play McCurdy . We had our receiver Kyle Sandoval showing lots of ram spirit. KEEP UP THE SPIRIT, KYLE!!

The Rams Football team played their first game against McCurdy High. They showed lots of team work and put up a pretty good game. Unfortunately we lost 7-27.








